Passengers on board Jin Air's Flt # 641 arriving from Incheon, Korea on January 25, 2022 were the first international passengers to utilize the Guam International Airport's new International Arrivals Corridor (IAC). The IAC sits atop the terminal gates and concourse, now dedicated solely to departing passengers, and completely separates arriving passenger with direct routing to the USCBP Hall.

The bee nursery has expanded and Island Honey Bee bottles award-winning honey for sale at their office. 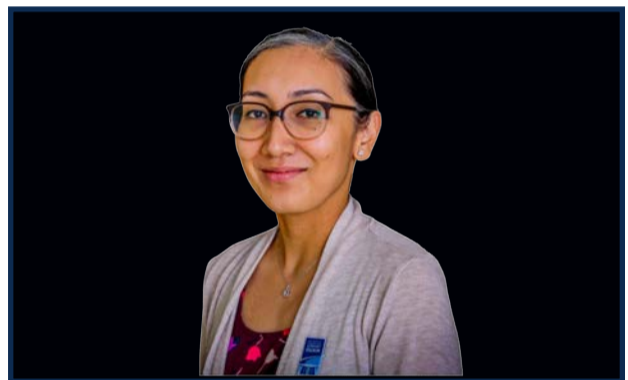
