

TSA Event Highlights Security Technologies at Guam Airport



The Airport and the Transportation Security Administration (TSA) work very closely in partnership to provide for a safe and secure travel environment. Over the years, TSA has expanded and invested in cutting-edge screening technology at Guam's only civilian airport to aid in that effort. On Friday, Sep. 22nd, they hosted a media event to discuss and demonstrate the type of technologies employed to screen departing travelers. Invited media representatives had the opportunity to observe first-hand the state-of-the-art systems. Lori Dankers, TSA Spokeswoman was on hand to answer media inquiries. TSA Assistant Federal Security Director Jorge Guerrero and his team were also present to display perhaps one of the the more interesting features of the event – the wild assortment of the most common prohibited items that are still routinely found in the carry-on luggage of travelers when they screen through the security checkpoints. It's incredible to think that travellers in this day and age think that these items can be allowed through security and onto a plane. One can't help but wonder... "What on earth were they thinking?"



Airport ARFF Committed to NEVER FORGET 9/11

The Airport's Aircraft Rescue and Fire Fighting (ARFF) Division executed a touching program of remembrance, making time to honor all who perished in the tragedy that unfolded on Sep 11, 2001. Their poignant tribute paid homage to all the victims but especially to first responders, law enforcement officers and the 343 firefighters who lost their lives in service that day. On the rainy Monday morning of Sept. 11th, members of ARFF mustered, and executed a water salute and completed a 5k, fully loaded in their firefighting gear, with a watch man announcing events of 9/11 and the time sequences as they had occurred on that fateful day. The Guam International Airport hosted their annual Table Top Exercise (TTX) on Sep. 26th at the new ARFF Facility Training Center. The TTX is a role-playing training effort that engages all stakeholders who would participate in a real world airport emergency situation. GIAA invited airline and local government partners, including first responders, law enforcement, medical organizations, and military and federal government, all their mutual aid partners, to go over a simulated emergency exercise, like an aircraft accident. Each organization explained

their processes and played out how their organization would respond from receipt of initial information to their notification process, the assembly and deployment of resources and the lending of assistance. This exercise helped everyone understand each others' roles and the various levels of engagement. It was a good opportunity to iron out details that would aid everyone in a real-world incident. GIAA extends an *Un Dangkulo na Si Yu'os Ma'ase'* to everyone who participated and helped make this year's TTX a success.



National Preparedness Month Wraps Up

Airport Sweeps AGA Awards


