GIAA Air Terminal Manager Juan Reyes and his team from the Operations Division conducted emergency preparation training for critical airport employees who comprise emergency response teams, Go Teams A & B. On Friday, November 18th members of both Go Teams, Division Heads and management went through all the necessary response activities and action items, upon establishing an Emergency Coordination Center (ECC) to ensure a coordinated response in the event that any emergency situation takes place on the airport's immense property footprint. Consistent training with a critical review of SOPs for improvement is neccessary to ensure that all employees are game ready whenever an emergency situation may arise!



On Friday, November 18th Platoon B from GIAA's Aircraft Rescue & Fire Fighting (ARFF) division participated in Career Day at Ordot Chalan Pago Elementary School. A group of very excited First Graders got to deploy a fire hose and learn about all the interesting tools used by firefighters and see all the components of a fire truck. Let's hope that our Airport ARFF team helped plant an inquisitive "spark" in the minds of these children to dream and work towards becoming firefighters to serve our island and future travelers.

**Successful Timed Drill** 


Frequent and regular training in emergency response only makes for an effective Airport response machinery. On Nov. 7th the Operations Division executed a timed response drill and the ARFF and Airport Police Divisions within responded the required time established by the Federal Avaiation Administration (FAA).

First School Tour of New ARFF Facility

Students from the Head Start Program of P.C. Lujan Elementary School got to be the very first group of students to tour the new \$27.2 million ARFF facility that just opened its doors in August. The new state-of-the-art facility replaces an old and outdated building built in the late 50's/ early 60's that the airport inherited when it took over operations of the Naval Air Station airfield in 1995. On Nov. 22nd the students got to tour the station which features the latest technology, enhancing our ARFF units' response readiness. The exited children got to see the quickly executed timed suit-up of ARFF personnel. The unique tools used by fire fighters were also shown to the children and their purposes explained.
