Guam Airport 'First' in Region with Approved Federal and Safety Requirements



The Guam Airport is the first in the region to receive approval of the Transportation Security Administration (TSA) Aviation Workers Screening (AWS) Program and was recognized to be in the top 4% of all Category 1 airports and the top 9% of all airports nationwide when assessed for full implementation of the Program. The AWS Program is designed to deter insider threats at airports across the country. The Guam Airport is also the first in the region to receive approval of its Federal Aviation

FOD, or Foreign Object Debris, poses a severe risk to aircraft, crew, and passengers on board, and it consists of a wide range




