Guam-CNMI Electronic Travel Authorization Goes Live



Passengers traveling to Guam or the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands (CNMI) will experience a smoother and more efficient arrival process.

The Department of Homeland Security and the United States Customs and Border Protection (USCBP) launched the G-CNMI ETA in September this year. This automated system, which became mandatory on November 29, 2024, is used to determine visitor eligibility to travel to Guam or the CNMI under the G-CNMI Visa Waiver Program (VWP) and whether such travel poses any law enforcement or security risk. This system provides eligible travelers with a faster, more streamlined arrival process and requires less paperwork.
