GIAA and Supporters Testify on Bill No. 67-38




Testimonies in support of Bill No. 67-38 were presented to the Legislative Oversight Committee on Air Transportation at the Congress Building on March 20, 2025. The bill is relative to providing GIAA the authority to adopt policies and procedures for the solicitation, selection, and award of agreements between GIAA and any other party for the use of airport facilities and properties for airport purposes and/ or visitor activities. Among others in support of the bill, GIAA Board Chairman - Brian Bamba, GIAA Executive Manager -John "JQ" M. Quinata, GIAA Deputy Executive Manager - Dr. Artemio "Ricky" Hernandez, and GVB President/CEO -



Regine Biscoe Lee provided their testimonies on the bill which authorizes GIAA to enter into lease agreements for a period of up to fifty (50) years - with concessions limited to a period of up to fifteen (15) years. A technical stop is a brief, scheduled stopover for the operational needs of an aircraft, such as refueling, maintenance, or crew rest. Some technical stops may be necessary to comply with customs, immigration, or other regulatory requirements. During technical stops, no passengers or cargo may embark or disembark unless authorized.

GIAA Operations Attend Airport Master Record Seminar

GIAA Executive Manager Presents Airport Operations Overview to UOG Students



GIAA Executive Manager, John "JQ" M. Quinata, delivered a presentation covering an overview of airport operations to Dr. Ron McNinch's students of the School of Business and Public Administration at the University of Guam (UOG) on March 5, 2025. Mr. Quinata shared pre-pandemic enplaned passenger activities in comparison to current numbers, as well as an update on passenger processing experience enhancements, such as the Transportation Security Administration security screening expansion and screening equipment upgrades. He provided updates regarding the implementation of the biometric exit process for international departures to satisfy U.S. Customs & Border Protection requirements and touched on GIAA's efforts to



work with current concessions for short-term extensions authorized by Guam law to reinvest and refresh offerings for passengers. Mr. Quinata discussed the implementation and effectiveness of the digitized Guam-CNMI visa waiver and Guam Customs Declaration Forms, allowing for a quicker and more efficient arrival process for passengers. He shared updates on Capital Improvement Projects, such as the International Arrivals Corridor, the terminal flooring upgrade, and refresh of the Arrivals Area, in addition to air service development efforts and the pursuit of new and increased air service, diversification of revenues through the increase of non-aeronautical revenues, and the continued pursuit of federal funds for Capital Improvement Projects.

GIAA Deputy Executive Manager Speaks at AGA Conference




