The management and staff of the A.B. Won Pat International Airport Authority, Guam join the Navarro and Japan Airlines (JAL) families in mourning the passing of **Robert "Bob" Yamagawa Navarro** on April 13, 2025. Fondly referred to as "Bobsan" by many in the Airport family, he was JAL's Guam Airport Station Manager and longtime member of the JAL family. He joined Japan Airlines in March 1973

and supported JAL's flight operations at Guam Airport during his impressive career spanning 52 years of dedicated service. Throughout his career with JAL, Bob was an active and contributing member of the Airport Operations Committee (AOC). One of many significant milestones during his tenure was the opening of the JAL flight crew training center for cadet pilots to train here at the Guam International Airport. Over 500 pilots have since been trained and certified in piloting two of JAL's fleet models that include the B737-800 and the B767-300; training on GIAA's fully certified runways in conformance with standards established by the Federal Aviation Administration and the International Civil Aviation Organization. Bob was a valued member of both the JAL and Airport teams. Our greatest sympathy and heartfelt condolences are extended to all who are impacted by Bob's passing. His leadership, insight and mostly his presence, amongst us will be greatly missed.

Inaugural Flights between Guam and Taipei Kick-Off April 2nd

On Wednesday, April 2, 2025, the Guam International Airport Authority joined the Guam Visitors Bureau and United Airlines (UA) to celebrate the inauguration of the airline's twice weekly air service between Guam and Taipei, Taiwan. The day kicked off with a 6:00 am ribbon-cutting ceremony attended by Governor Lou Leon Guerrero, Lt. Governor Joshua Tenorio, Senator Jesse Lujan, who has legislative oversight over transportation, along with Taipei Economic and Cultural Office Director General Chia Ping Liu. On hand from the GIAA were Board Chair Brian Bamba, Board Secretary Donald Weakley, Airport Executive Manager John "JQ" Quinata, the Deputy Executive Manager "Ricky" Hernandez, PhD, Airport Comptroller Dafne Mansapit-Shimizu and UA's General Manager Tammy Castro and the outbound flight crew. Refreshments of coffee and donuts were served to passengers on the 7:00 am departure flight to Taipei. Later in the afternoon at 4:20 pm, the passengers on the inaugural inbound flight from Taipei were greeted in the jetway with a giftbag, and warmly welcomed by the Kiko' the KoKo Bird and management and staff from GIAA, GVB and UA. Kiko' then quickly made his way to the baggage claim area to join the cultural entertainers to spread more Hafa Adai spirit and welcoming CHamoru hospitality! Flights will be on Wednesdays and Saturdays on a Boeing 737-800 aircraft, with 166 seats, 16 of which will be in the business class cabin.

Aerodrome Certification Workshop 2025



The Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands (CNMI) Ports Authority kicked off the four-day Aerodrome Certification Workshop on April 21, 2025., in partnership with the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) Airports District Office (ADO) based in Hawaii. Hosting rotates between Guam, (CNMI) and the freely associated states of the region, which include the Federated States of Micronesia, the Republic of Palau and the Republic of the Marshal Islands. This forum affords an opportunity for our region to come together with other stakeholders and aviation subject matter experts to share best practices and how they've overcome challenges or solved or found ways

to work around some of the pressing issues facing their respective airports. They also share in the training to keep their facilities, operations and ARFF fully compliant with both operational and safety standard as set and required by the FAA and the International Civil Aviation Authority (ICAO). This year's workshop theme was "Airport Recovery and Safety through Innovations and Regional Partnerships". The delegation from the Guam International Airport Authority with 4 members presenting included Airport Exec. Mgr. John Quinata, Dep. Exec. GCQA K-9 Handlers Certification Ceremony



The Guam Customs & Quarantine Agency (CQA) held a certification ceremony in partnership with the Guam Police Department (GPD) and the Department of Corrections (DOC) to recognize seven (7) new K-9 units on Friday, April 25th at the A.B. Won Pat International Airport Authority. These handlers and their canine partners recently completed their intensive three-month long training in illicit narcotics detection in Basic Narcotic Detection Course from the Drug Detector Dog Unit Canine Training Academy. The curriculum included the practical application of various skills required in canine handling. This included kennel maintenance, animal husbandry, safety, and bonding, occupational health and stress management, canine drives and character traits, understanding of capabilities and limitations in various conditions, search rituals and patterns, and proper record keeping. Sgt. Harrilee Matsumoto-Webber, Officer Hurao Iriarte, and Officer Joshua Togawa from GPD along with Cpl. Bruce Flores, Officer Jesse Cruz, Officer Ron Joseph Hocog, and Officer Ryan Ruiz from DOC along with their canines

were part of this first ever collaboration and partnership between these three GovGuam agencies investing in capacity building across our law enforcement organizations. In training more uniformed officers with specialized skill sets serves to strengthen our public safety network and shores up our resources in combating the illicit drug epidemic on island. 

May 7th is Deadline for REAL I.D. Compliance

On May 7, 2025, the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) rule goes into effect requiring U.S. travelers to be REAL I.D. compliant to board domestic flights. **However, a REAL I.D. alone is not sufficient identification for travel from Guam to Honolulu.** It does not prove that the traveler is admissible to the United States, which is required pursuant to 8 CFR 235.5 to board the Guam to Honolulu flight. A traveler can provide various forms of documentation to prove their lawful status in the United States, depending on their visa type, immigration status, or citizenship. Some of the most common documents that can be provided as proof are as follows:

- U.S. Passport (for U.S. Citizens)
- Permanent Resident Card (Green Card)
- U.S. Birth Certificate w/ valid and unexpired government issued
 - I.D. (Driver's License, Guam I.D., etc.)
- Employment Authorization Document (EAD) w/ a valid and unexpired passport and U.S. Visa
- Visa (Non-Immigrant)
- Refugee or Asylee Documentation
- Naturalization Certificate (for U.S. Citizens) w/ a valid and unexpired government issued I.D.
- Advance Parole Document
- Temporary Protected Status (TPS) Documentation
